

Baker was one of the two men so honored by the Tournament Committee this year. He shares the distinction with Hareld Schum, the athletic director at the Spencerport Central School District.

The Tournament Committee said that they selected Baker and Schum for the honor because their "presence in Section V has helped make this the most exciting section of the New York State Public High School Athletic Association."

The coaches' biographies were prominently displayed in the opening pages of the Section V basketball tournament programs.

Baker has been a coach for LCS since 1942. His coaching record includes 19 league championships and two Section V basketball titles (1945 and 1950).

Baker is also the Section V Baseball chairman and the New York State chairman for baseball.

Livonia's outstanding coach is an Ithaca College alumnus. He grew up in Shortsville and taught in Gainesville and Lima before settling in Livonia in 1942.

When he joined the Livonia staff, he coached soccer, basketball and baseball in addition to teaching physical education. in 1946, soccer was eliminated from the inter-scholastic program and football was substituted. Baker took on the gridiron coaching duties until 1967.

Baker was instrumental in bringing little league baseball to Livonia and also started a Saturday morning baseball league in 1945 for boys in grades five through eight. He is also credited
